## CIRCULAR-4

Subject: Implementation of Revised Examination and Evaluation System of Undergraduate Degrees as per the NEP-2020 based ICAR-Sixth Deans' Committee Recommended & DICC Approved UG Degrees' Syllabi....

As per the discussion and decision taken on the Sub. No. 5 of the 108<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Directors of Instruction Coordination Committee (DICC) held on 9<sup>th</sup> July 2025 at MAUEB, MCAER, Pune, it was decided to adopt the Revised (New) Examination and Evaluation System in respect of all Under-graduate degrees in the Maharashtra State Agril. Universities w.e.f. Academic Year, 2025-26 [i.e. in respect of I (New) & III (New) semesters of AY, 2025-26] with progressive evaluation element and revised marking pattern as suggested by the NEP-2020-based ICAR-Sixth Deans' Committee Report Syllabi in following manner.

(i) As per the DICC approved Revised UG Examination and Evaluation System, all the courses are to be evaluated for the Total of 100 Marks irrespective of the Credits Hrs. The distribution of marks with revised Examination and Evaluation system is hereby recommended as furnished in the Table 1 below:

- (ii) Accordingly, in line with the above structure, the Course-wise **Result Sheets/Forms** (**Proformas**) provided at <u>Annexures I–III</u> shall be prepared and maintained as per the prescribed distribution of marks, which will be implemented from the Academic Year, 2025-26 for the New Syllabus scheme only.
- (iii) For the Semester End Theory Examinations, the question paper shall be set and obtained from the Experts by the **MAUEB** (**Examination Board**). The HoDs of the respective departments will ensure due coverage of the syllabus with the provision of moderation.
- (iv) The duration of the Semester End Theory Examination shall be **2 hours** for Courses with both Theory and Practical components, and **2.5 hours** for Courses having only Theory component. Mid-term Examination will normally be of **1-hour** duration. The format and duration of Progressive Assessment will be decided by the Course Teacher in consultation with the Associate Dean/Principal of the College.
- (v) During **Progressive Assessment**, following (Table 2) timeline, assessment type, scope and focus should be followed by the Course Teacher based on the type of course being taught:

Assignments should normally be submitted by students in hand-written form and limited to 10-12 pages.

Group Assignments may also be allotted, where appropriate.

- (vi) The evaluation of **Internship** (10-week) for the students with exit-option, will be done both by the Parent University/Institute and the Host Industry/Organisation. The student shall submit a Report to the parent institute and present the learnings before the other students and faculty after the internship programme. The respective University/ Parent Institute may develop their UG Degree-wise Assessment Proforma with 50% weightage for each (i.e. University & Host Organization).
- (vii) It is mandatory for each Student to complete **Total 10 Credit Hrs.** (Non-gradial) of **Online Courses** (MOOCs) from available resources across III to VIII semesters under the guidance of assigned Faculty/Advisor. The Online/MOOC courses, be successfully completed by the student, will be indicated in the Transcript with 'Satisfactory (S)' or 'Not satisfactory (NS)' remark, as the case may be.
- (viii) When students take **Need-based/Deficiency Course(s)**, they shall be assessed as 'Satisfactory (S)' or 'Not satisfactory (NS)' result without any grade points.

(ix) Passing Requirements for the various types of courses (Table 3):

The Registered Student must have minimum requirement of attendance of 70% in each course, failing which will be treated as "Non-Registration due to Shortage of Attendance [NR(SOA)]" and must Re-register for the said course, when it is next offered.

- (x) If any Progressive Assessment or Semester End Practical Examination (SEPE) coincides with the notified events, the College/University will arrange separate examinations for the participating students, without causing significant delay.
- (xi) There will be a uniform system of the Evaluation and Grading to be followed in all MH-SAUs with Grade Point Average (GPA) system as follows-

The evaluation will be done on a 10-point scale i.e. 10 Points = 100 Marks

> The Grade Point (GP of a Course) is a numerical value obtained by dividing the percentage of marks secured in a course by 10.

GP = Percentage of Marks obtained / 10

> The Grade Point Average (GPA) for a semester will be calculated as follows:

$$\textit{GPA} = \frac{\sum (\textit{Grade point} \times \textit{Credit hours})_{\textit{in one semester}}}{\mathsf{Total Credit hours in respective Semester}}$$

> The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) earned at any stage of the degree (until last semester) will be calculated as follows.

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum (Grade\ point\ \times Credit\ hours)_{until\ last\ semester}}{\text{Total\ Credit\ hours\ until\ last\ Semester}}$$

> The Final CGPA after completion of all the semesters, will be mentioned in the 'Final University Transcript' of the student at the end of the degree.

All the Colleges are directed hereby to implement this <u>Revised System of Examination and Evaluation</u> from I (New) & III (New) Semesters of Acad. Year, 2025-26 onwards (i.e. for the Batch admitted in the AY, 2024-25 and for the batch admitted in the AY, 2025-26) and submit their Undertaking/ Compliance Report to the respective DI & Dean (F/A) at the earliest.

The Directors of Instructions (DI) & Deans (F/A), Associate Deans and Principals are also requested to ensure that these changes are brought to the attention of all relevant stakeholders viz., UG Teaching Staff, concerned Non-Teaching Staff, Students, Registrar/ Dy. Registrar (Acad.), Software System Developers and all the concerned for uniform and effective implementation as per the ICAR-Sixth Deans' Committee Report and DICC Guidelines.
