Besides, I would also like to mention here that we are approaching a *Rabi* season which again seems to be challenging for the Vidarbha farmers, due to a long dry spell that resulting reduced soil moisture. But the University do have the technologies to deal with such situations and accordingly, the farmers should adopt the University recommendations. Timely sowing of rabi crops like Wheat, Gram, Safflower should be done using varieties like SPV-504, PKV kranti, CSV 14R of wheat; Gram's Jaki 9218, PDKV Kanchan for rainfed and PKV Kabuli 2 and 4 for irrigated condition and Bhima, PKV Pink and AKS-207 of Safflower. Seed treatment is an extremely important practice that must be followed as per the recommendations. University has organized the Shivar pheri on October 20-22 where more than 6000 farmers took benefit of knowing all the technologies and got their queries adressed for the ensuing *rabi* season. I appeal all the farmers of this region to adopt improved technologies of the University in the ensuing Rabi season.

Dr. PDKV is celebrating its Golden Jubilee year during October 2018 to October 2019. Besides, our committed efforts for farmers of this region and elsewhere, my emphasis will also be on the sports activities for the students and employees so that they can bring name and fame for the University at National level besides being able to deal with their heavy workloads with positive attitude.

Hence Solar Light Insect Trap overcome these problems and is useful in organic farming too. This trap is very useful for farmer and university feels proud to develop these type of technologies.

Demonstration on Azolla Cultivation



Azolla cultivation technology is considered as an intervention to meet the need of dairy farmers. On a dry weight basis, azolla has protein content between 13 to 24 per cent; one hectare of azolla can produce 1 to 2 tons of fodder per day, equivalent to 10 to 30 kg of protein per day. When these statistics are considered, azolla has a tremendous potential as a fodder crop in India. The method demonstration on Azolla production technology was conducted by Dr. Ganesh Kaluse and KVK team of Dr. Bharti R. Tijare (SMS, Agronomy), Shri Anil Taru (SMS, Horti.) and Dr. Kuntal Satkar (SRF, NICRA) with active participation of 31 farmers.

Skill Training for Rural Youth



KVK, Sakoli (Bhandara) had successfully organized seven days' residential skill oriented training for rural youths on "Goat Farming and Management" from 24 to 30 September 2018.
