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ABOUT NATIONAL CADET CORPS...

Birth of the National Cadet Corps

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) in Universities was conceptualized by the British Government with an aim for raising a second line of defense and to create a large pool of trained youth available for Armed Forces during the First World War.

The Kashmir War of 1948 taught a very important lesson to India, that freedom needs to be protected by strong Armed Forces. The war in Kashmir and the consequent loss of a portion of Indian territory; the open support of Western Powers to Pakistan in the Security Council of the United Nations, made it more than evident to the Indian leaders that they not only had to strengthen the Armed Forces but also create sufficient strength of reserves, who could take up arms, when required. The gravity of time and event found expression in the Indian Legislature through anxious and pressing demand for military training of young men and women throughout the country.

Its immediate manifestation was that the Cadet Corps Committee which was formed on 29 Sep 1946 with Pt HN Kunzru as chairman, placed forward the recommendations before the Constituent Assembly (Legislature) on 13 Mar 1948. A draft Bill was sent to the Constituent Assembly (Legislative) on 19 Mar 1948, which evoked great interest and enthusiasm amongst all members. After due deliberations and amendments, the Bill was passed by the Assembly on 08 Apr 1948. The Central Govt accepted the opinion of the Provincial Govts and the Standing Committee's recommendations for the formation of a Cadet Corps which was to be named as "National Cadet Corps", as recommended by the Kunzuru Committee.

The Bill received the assent of the Governor General on 16 Apr 1948, and the National Cadet Corps came into being by an Act of the Parliament Act No. XXXI of 1948 designated 'The National Cadet Corps Act 1948'. This Act with 13 clauses, prescribed the formation of the National Cadet Corps in India.

The first step in the process of raising of the NCC was setting up of the NCC Secretariat now called Headquarters Directorate General NCC. In fact, even before the NCC Bill was passed by the Constituent Assembly (Legislative), the Ministry of Defense had set up the nucleus of the

NCC Secretariat, with Col (later retired as Chief of Army Staff) GopalGurunathBewoor as first Director of the NCC. He took over as Director of NCC on 31 Mar 1948.

AIMS OF NCC

The 'Aims' of the NCC laid out in 1988 have stood the test of time and continue to meet the requirements expected of it in the current socio—economic scenario of the country. The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. Further, it aims at creating a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. Needless to say, the NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join the armed forces.

MOTTO of NCC

The need for having motto for the Corps was discussed in the 11th Central Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting held on 11 Aug 1978. The mottos suggested were "Duty and Discipline"; "Duty, Unity and Discipline"; "Duty and Unity"; "Unity and Discipline". The final decision for selection of "Unity and Discipline" as motto for the NCC was taken in the 12th CAC meeting held on 12 Oct 1980.

CORE VALUES

The NCC is a responsive, learning and continuously evolving organization. Its activity is guided by certain **Core Values** that we endeavour to instill among all ranks of the NCC. These include the following:

- a) A sense of patriotic commitment to encourage cadets to contribute to national development.
- b) Respect for diversities in religion, language, culture, ethnicity, life style and habitat to instill a sense of National unity and social cohesion.
- c) Abiding commitment to learn and adhere to the norms and values enshrined in the Indian Constitution.
- d) Understanding the value of a just and impartial exercise of authority.
- e) Ability to participate in community development and other social programme.
- f) A healthy life style free of substance abuse and other unhealthy practices.
- g) Sensitivity to the needs of poor and socially disadvantaged fellow citizens.
- h) Inculcating habits of restraint and self-awareness.
- Understanding the values of honesty, truthfulness, self-sacrifice, perseverance and hard work.
- j) Respect for knowledge, wisdom and the power of ideas.

NCC FLAG



The three colors in the flag depict the three services of the Corps, red for the Army, deep blue for the Navy and light blue for the Air Force. The letters NCC and the NCC crest in gold in the middle of the flag encircled by a wreath of lotus, these 17 lotuses represent the 16 Directorates. "Unity and Discipline" (EktaaurAnushasan) is written at the bottom of the NCC Flag.

NCC ORGANIZATION

The Headquarters is located in Delhi. There are 17 Directorates located in the state capitals headed by an officer of the rank of a Brigadier. Directorates have up to 14 Group HQs under them through which they exercise their command and control of the organization in the state. Each group is headed by an officer of the rank of Colonel or equivalent known as Group Commander. Each NCC GHQs control 5-7 units (Battalions) commanded by Lt. Colonel/Major or equivalent. Each Battalion consists of companies which are commanded by Associate NCC Officer(ANO) of the rank of lieutenant to major. In all there are 95 GHQs in the country who exercise control over a network of 667 Army wing units. There are two training establishments namely Officers Training Academy, Kamptee and Women Officers Training Academy, Gwalior.





ENROLMENT OF STUDENTS AS NCC CADETS

Eligibility Conditions

- 1. Citizen of India or a subject of Nepal.
- 2. Bearing good moral character.
- 3. Enrolled in an educational institution.
- 4. Meets the prescribed medical standards.
- 5. Age
 - Junior Division/Wing (Boys/Girls) 12 years to 18½ years
 - Senior Division/Wing (Boys/Girls) Upto 26 years
- 6. Enrolment Period
 - a. Junior Division/Wing (Boys/Girls) 2 years
 - b. Senior Division/Wing (Boys/Girls) 3 years

Application for Enrollment:-

- 1. A student desirous of being enrolled in the Senior Division shall apply to the Officer commanding the unit.
- 2. The Officer to whom an application under sub-rule (1) has been made, shall cause the applicant to fill up and sign in his presence a statement in Form I.

Verification

When an application is made to a Commanding Officer under rule 7, he shall satisfy himself that the application is in proper form and that the applicant fulfils the conditions of enrolment specified in rule 5 or 6, as the case may be. The Commanding Officer or the Headmaster may make such further enquiry regarding the suitability of the applicant for enrolment in the unit or part thereof in which he desires to be enrolled, as may be prescribed in this behalf, by the State Government.

Medical Examination

If the Commanding Officer is satisfied that the application is in order, and that the applicant fulfils the conditions of enrolment and that he is suitable for enrolment in the unit or part thereof in which he desires to be enrolled, he shall cause the applicant to be medically examined.

If the Commanding Officer or the Headmaster is not satisfied that the application is in order or that the applicant fulfils the conditions of enrolment or that he is suitable to be enrolled in the unit or part thereof or the applicant is reported to be medically unfit for service in the National Cadet Corps, the Commanding Officer shall reject the application and shall inform the applicant accordingly.

Method of Enrollment-

- 1. If the Commanding Officer does not reject the application, the applicant shall be accepted for enrolment in the Senior Division/Wing, and shall be required to sign a declaration in Form I. If the applicant is a minor, his father or guardian shall also be required to sign a declaration provided in the form.
- 2. If the Commanding Officer is satisfied that the applicant, or his father or guardian in the case of a minor applicant, understand the questions put to the applicant and consent to the conditions of service, he shall sign a certificate to that effect on the said Form, and the applicant shall thereupon be deemed to have been enrolled.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CERTIFICATE EXAMS

'A' CERTIFICATE

- 1. The Cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of total training periods laid down in the syllabus for the first and second years of Junior Division/Wing NCC (All Wings).
- 2. In order to count his previous tenure, the break in the NCC Training Tenure of the cadet prior to his appearing in the exam should not exceed more than 12 months at one time.
- 3. In case the break exceeds 12 months the following procedure will be followed:
 - a. If he has been on the unit rolls for a minimum of two years before his discharge and had attended 75% of the total periods during his NCC Tenure he will need another 36 periods of training to become eligible toappear for Certificate A examination.

- b. In all other cases, where above conditions are not fulfilled, the cadet must attend a minimum of 75% periods of the first and second years of training.
- c. Must have attended one Annual Training Camp.

'B' CERTIFICATE

- 1. The cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of total training periods laid down in the syllabus for the first and second years for Senior Division/Wing NCC (All Wings).
- 2. Break in the NCC Training Tenure of the cadet SD/SW prior to appearing in the exam should not exceed more than 18 months at one time after his discharge to count his tenure for Certificate B Examination.
- 3. In case the break exceeds 18 months the following procedure will be adopted:
 - a. If he had been on the unit rolls for a minimum of two years before his discharge and had attended 75% of the total periods during his NCC Tenure he will need another 36 periods of training to become eligible toappear for Certificate B Examination.
 - b. In all other cases where above conditions are not fulfilled the cadet must attend a minimum of 75% periodsof the first & second years of training.
 - c. Must have attended one Annual Training Camp /NIC /COC / RDC / Attachment with Regular Army/Navy/Air Force.
- 4. Cadets possessing Certificate A will be awarded 10 bonus marks.

'C' CERTIFICATE

- 1. The cadet must be in possession of Certificate B.
- 2. The cadet must be in third year of Senior Division/Senior Wing NCC Training.
- 3. The cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of the periods of 3rdyear syllabus during the academic session.
- 4. Break in the NCC Training Tenure of the cadet SD/SW prior to appearing in the Exam should not exceed more than 18 months at one time after his discharge to count his previous tenure for Certificate C examination.
- 5. In case the break exceeds 18 months the following procedure will be adopted:
 - a. If he had been on the unit rolls for a minimum of two years before his discharge and attended 75% of thetotal period during his NCC Tenure he will need another 30 periods of training to become eligible for Certificate C examination.

- b. In other cases where above conditions are not fulfilled, the cadet must attend a minimum of 75% periodsof the third year of training.
- 6. Must have attended one ATC and in addition one of the following in three years tenure:
 - c. Annual Training Camp (This is in addition to one mentioned above).
 - d. Republic Day Camp at Delhi (RDC).
 - e. Centrally Organized Camp (COC).
 - f. Para Training Camp (PTC).
 - g. National Integration Camp (NIC).
 - h. All India Trekking Expedition (HQ DGNCC Organized).
 - i. All India Mountaineering Expedition (HQ DGNCC Organized).
 - j. Attachment Training with any one of the following:-
 - Army Unit.
 - Service Hospital.

i. Any one of the following Adventure Courses

- I. Mountaineering Basic Course.
- II. Mountaineering Advance Course.
- III. Water Skiing/Snow Skiing Courses.
- IV. Snow & Ice (Condensed) Course.
 - i. Sailing expedition with actual sailing exceeding 10 days
- V. Scuba Diving Course.
- VI. Youth Exchange Programme.
- 7. Cadets will be allowed to appear for Certificate C examination only after one year of passing Certificate B examination.

NCC Training Activities

The training activities of NCC can be broadly classified as under:-

(a) Institutional Training Camps and Attachment Training

- (i) Camp Training.
- (ii) Attachment Training (Service/Units).
- (iii) Naval Wing Activities.
- (iv) Air Wing Activities.
- (b) Social Service and Community Development Activities.
- (c) Youth Exchange Programme (YEP).
- (d) Adventure Training and Sports.

Institutional Training:

This training is mostly carried out in schools and colleges by the cadets. In addition, depending upon the type of wing, basic knowledge of that Service is imparted to the cadetse.g gliding and powered flying for Air Wing cadets and boat pulling and sailing for Naval Wing cadets.

Camp Training:

Camp training constitutes the most important part of NCC training. Every cadet in the NCC is expected to attend at least two camps during one's tenure to complete the Training Syllabi.

(a) Annual Training Camps (ATC)

These are held within the state under the aegis of respective NCC Directorates. The camps are of 12 days duration for senior boys/girls and 10 days duration for junior boys/girls.

(b) Centrally Organised Camps (COC).

These camps are of all India nature and are planned by HQ DGNCC in consultation with the Directorates nominated to conduct them. Selected cadets, as per the vacancies allotted to each Directorate, participate in these camps. The following types of centrally organized camps are conducted.

(i) Leadership Camps. These camps are conducted on all India basis. There are four Advance Leadership Camps (ALC) and three Basic Leadership Camps held each year.

- (ii) ThalSainik Camp (TSC). Two TSCs are conducted at RD parade ground, Delhi Cantt every year i.e. one for SD/JD boys and the other for SW/JW girls.
- (iii) VayuSainik Camp (VSC). This Centrally Organised Camp is organised for Air Wing Cadets. Cadets from all Directorates attend the camp. VSC is generally conducted in the month of Oct.
- (iv) NauSainikCamp(NSC). This Centrally Organized Naval Camp is conducted annually for selected Naval Wing Cadets. Boat pulling, regatta and sailing competitions are the main attractions of this camp.
- (v) Rock Climbing Camps. Rock climbing camps are held each year to expose the cadets to the basics of rock climbing and to inculcate the spirit of adventure.
- (vi) National Integration Camps (NIC). The Camps are conducted on an all India basis and help bridge the cultural gap among various states of India. In addition the NCC conducts NICs at remote and forward areas to promote national integration. Special NICs are conducted regularly at Leh, Srinagar, North Eastern Region and at Port Blair.
- (vii) Republic Day Camp (RDC) and Prime Minister's (PM's) Rally. The Republic Day Camp is a prestigious camp inaugurated by the Vice President of India and visited by the RakshaMantri, RakshaRajyaMantri, Chief Minister of Delhi, the three Service Chiefs and other dignitaries. During the Camp a Horse show and cultural programmes are held wherein important dignitaries are invited as Chief Guests. The camp culminates in the Prime Minister's Rally on 27 January every year which showcases all the activities of NCC.

Attachment Training.

NCC Army Wing cadets are given an opportunity to live and work in regular Service units in the form of attachment training. Every year a large number of officers and cadets including women officers and Senior Wing girl cadets get attached to various units of the Army for duration of two weeks.

(a) Attachment to Indian Military Academy (IMA) and Officers Training Academy (OTA). Every year selected SD/SW cadets are given attachment training with IMA and OTA respectively.

(b) Naval Wing Activities.

Naval wing syllabus is common for both boys & girls. During sea training naval subjects like Seamanship, Navigation, Communication, Gunnery, Damage Control and Ship Safety are taught to cadets. Swimming, Scuba Diving and Wind Surfing are other interesting activities.

(c) Air Wing Activities.

Gliding, Microlite Flying and attachment training with AirForce Stations/Establishments are the main activities.

Social Service and Community Development

NCC has adopted community development activities with the aim of NCC cadets imbibing selfless service to the community, dignity of labor, importance of self help, need to protect the environment and to assist weaker sections of society in their upliftment. Some of the major activities are:-

- (a) Tree Plantation. NCC cadets plant saplings and look after them in conjunction with the concerned State Departments.
- **(b) Blood Donation.** Cadets donate blood as voluntary service whenever needed by Hospitals/Red Cross.
- (c) **Old Age Homes.**Old Age Homes in the country are patronised and regularly visited by NCC cadets.
- (d) Adult Education. NCC cadets visit remote areas, villages and underdeveloped areas toemphasize the need for education and to assist in the conduct of the Adult Education Programmes.
- **(e) Community Work.** Cadets of NCC participate in the rural and urban community projects and other development works like village track improvement, cleaning of streets and ponds, sanitation drives etc.
- **(f) Disaster Relief.** NCC has always extended immediate support during natural disasters and accidents. NCC cadets are trained to provide services during floods, earthquakes, cyclones and major train accidents etc.
- (g) AIDS Awareness Programme. NCC participates actively in the AIDS awareness Programme and is presently working alongwith UNAIDS and DG AFMS in carrying out AIDS Awareness Programmes throughout the country.
- (h) Cancer Awareness Programme. NCC cadets actively participate in Cancer

Awareness Programmesorganised at various cities.

Youth Exchange Programme (YEP)

The aim of YEP is a country-to-country exchange of cadets belonging to NCC/equivalent Govt/Youth Organizations of friendly countries and participation in NCC activities of the host country to create an increased awareness among participants and appreciation of each others' socio-economic and cultural realities.

Adventure Training and Sports

NCC takes part in Subroto Cup Football Tournament, Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Cup Tournament and Mavlankar Shooting Championship on regular basis. Other than this, NCC cadets take part in Mountaineering, Trekking and Cycle/Motorcycle expeditions, Parachute Sailing, Para Courses, Slithering, Desert Safari and White Water Rafting.

ADVANTAGES OF NCC TRAINING

There are several advantages of undertaking an NCC training, such as:

- i. NCC Cadets develop qualities like social service, team spirit, leadership discipline and self-confidence.
- ii. NCC camps are held at different places in the country hence cadets get opportunity to visit important historical and industrial places and social centres and widen their horizon and develop ambition to do creative work.
- iii. NCC cadets are taught civil defence and self-defence. Due to this cadets develop national spirit and confidence.
- iv. NCC cadets are attached with army units every year so that they get acquainted with the army life.
- v. NCC cadets are trained for parachute jumps and mountaineering so that they develop capacity to do courageous work.
- vi. Selected cadets are sent to foreign countries every year.
- vii. 32 seats are reserved per course in the IMA for cadets who have passed NCC C certificate examination. NCC cadets having 50% aggregate marks in graduation with minimum 'B' grade in 'C' certificate examination are eligible for short service commission (NCC special entry scheme) without qualifying CDS written examination. They can face direct SSB interview.
- viii. NCC trained cadets are given preference in recruitment of armed forces.
 - ix. Many Industrialists give priority in jobs to NCC trained cadets.
 - x. Central and State Governments also give priority in jobs to NCC cadets.
- xi. Priority is given to NCC trained students by Universities in B.Ed, MA, MSc admission and hostel.
- xii. NCC trained students are given priority in recruitment in Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and Border Security Force (BSF) etc.
- xiii. NCC cadets are given refreshment on every parade and are given washing allowance for uniform.
- xiv. NCC cadets are given facility to purchase goods from military canteen.
- xv. In case of death or becoming permanently handicapped of an NCC cadet during NCC activities, a sum of 2,00,000 is paid by NCC welfare society.

EVOLUTION OF NCC IN DR.PANJABRAO DESHMUKH KRISHI VIDYAPEETH, AKOLA

- The National Cadet Corps (NCC) Unit was established in Dr. PDKV, Akola during 1972 under the aegis of 11 Maharashtra Battalion NCC, Akola and under the higher command of Amravati Group Headquarters, Amravati of Maharashtra Directorate.
- The NCC unit of Dr. PDKV, Akola operates under the administrative umbrella of the Directorate of Student Welfare based at the main campus of the University.
- The unit marked its foundation with the enrollment of 70 cadets in the year 1972 which had apparently grown to a cadet capacity of 106 in 2019-20 and ultimately to 132 in 2020-21. However after the disastrous COVID-19 pandemic phase the admission schedule of Dr. PDKV, Akola was hampered and caused delay in enrollment process for the year 2021-22. Consequently the cadet capacity was reduced to 129 in the 2022-23.
- In the year 2017 as per the V-Dean Committee of SAU of Maharashtra, the NCC was incorporated as elective subject of 0+1 credit practical course in the Undergraduate degree programme of B.Sc.(Hons.) Forestry at College of Forestry of Dr. PDKV, Akola. The same was imposed by the ICAR through MoD for all constituent colleges of the University but except Forestry, the College of Horticulture/ Agriculture and Agricultural Engineering and Technology are yet to implement the same. However students from all four constituent colleges in the campus of Dr.PDKV, Akola are part of enrolled strength of NCC unit.
- Dr.PDKV, Akola has autonomous NCC unit office amidst the stadium in the University campus. The unit has an official decorum as per the standard directed by DG, NCC, N.Delhi. The office consists of ANO's office, conference hall, kote, library and the Adm.Section. The unit bears the enrollment record of cadets, maintains record of uniform and accessories issue, washing allowance, refreshment allowance, stitching allowance, Parades conducted, attendance record, activities conducted and participated record etc.

The University has a history of very eminent officers catering to National Cadet Corps.






